## **To Be a People ‘On the Way’**

As we enter this second month of physical isolation, I have found myself meditating on the experience of the Israelites wandering in the wilderness after the escape from slavery in Egypt. Forty years they spent out there, in the unknown of the wilderness, unsure when their isolation and suffering would end. Forty years! Perhaps now, we are starting to get a sense of why they might have been distracted and grumbling.

Still, one of the things I find hopeful is that Israel wasn't left alone in the wilderness. God kept turning up. God kept interrupting them. And, God kept providing for them, even if that provision didn't always feel particularly satisfactory (small amounts of manna in the desert).

How Israel must have longed to arrive in the promised land, as we long to be back together worshipping once more. I look forward to celebrating communion with you all again some day soon.

But, part of our Uniting Church tradition is remembering that our worship building is not, in fact, the promised land.

We have a much larger vision into which we seek to live: the Kingdom of God.

The Basis of Union makes clear that ‘the Church is a pilgrim people, always on the way towards a promised goal: here the Church does not have a continuing city but seeks one to come. On the way Christ feeds

## What is Pastoral Care?

What do the words 'Pastoral Care' mean to you?

Perhaps the term conjures up images of a counselling session? Or perhaps of a shepherd in a field? Maybe you think 'pastoral care' is something that 'the Minister does', or perhaps the term may seem old-fashioned.

At its heart, Pastoral Care is simply the love that members of the Christian community (the Church) show to one another. It may be formal (as in pastoral counselling, or visits by the minister) or informal (through friendships and fellowship). At its heart however, pastoral care is always modelled on the life of Jesus Christ, and the love he showed to both friends and strangers. As such, pastoral care is not just for the good of the Church, but for the whole world. Yet, it can never be completely separate from the Christian community either.



As Pastoral Care is a very hard term to define, there are a number of images which may be helpful. These include:

- **The shepherd:** provides rest, comfort, restoration, protection, nurture and guidance for the flock.
- **The wound healer:** the wounds of our life help us gain wisdom and offer understanding for the pain of others.
- **The horse-tram:** Like a second horse, ready to help with an extra load.
- **The host and guest:** Hospitality – A friendly space to find and maintain our own centre and offer that freedom to others; welcoming strangers into our group.
- **The bridge builder:** A good communicator or mediator, safely spanning life's problems and bringing people together.
- **The companion:** The person with whom we share the necessities of life.
