Lent: A Season of Discipleship

Since ancient times, the Church has used the 40 days of Lent (which start this year on 17 February) as an intentional season of prayer and discipleship. Indeed, still today this is the time of preparation for many new Christians seeking to be baptized into the faith and family of Jesus Christ.

In the Methodist tradition (one of the traditions that forms part of the Uniting Church), there was a practice known as the covenant service. Each year, the whole congregation would gather in worship and share in renewing the covenant with God and making promises about how they would attempt to live for the next twelve months. Covenants were also an important part of the Presbyterian and

Congregationalist tradition, and so for many of you there is a good chance you remember these covenant services.

This year, you are invited to use the season of Lent as an intentional season of discipleship – to discern how you might draw closer to God, participate in the life of the congregation, and serve your neighbours.

Attached to this newsletter is a template for a Discipleship Covenant. This form is a guide – an outline of some things you might like to think about. ***You may choose to discuss it with Daniel or one of the Elders (especially when it comes to the resources section), or you might prefer to just use it***

In working through this covenant, I invite you to think about where you might have seen God's love at work in your own life. Where is God moving today? Why is this story of faith important to you? Where might you be called to witness God's movement? How (word, deed, prayer) might God be calling you to participate in the story of redemption for the *whole* of creation?



Pastoral Notices

Since the last newsletter, there have been two deaths linked to the life of our congregation.

Betty Stokes (the mother of Louise Stokes) was a resident of Viewhaven for the last four years and had previously been a member of the Methodist and then Uniting Churches in Sydney.
