The Work Of The Spirit

In the month of May, we are going to undertake a Sermon Series titles, *The Work Of The Spirit*. In Christian theology, the Holy Spirit may be the most misunderstood and most overlooked person of the Trinity. This is a great shame, for the work of the Spirit is vital for the life of the Church. Indeed, without the Spirit, none of us would be here at all.

In his book, What Happens in Holy Communion, the German theologian Michael Welker writes,

If we want to get clear about God's presence and activity among human

beings, we must talk about God's spirit. Through the Holy Spirit, God works among creatures. Through the Holy Spirit they are connected, strengthened, preserved, and renewed. Through the Spirit they are brought into communion with the risen Christ. In the Spirit the risen Christ is near them and active among them. Through the Spirit they are enabled to act in remembrance of him and live in his memory. The activity of the Holy Spirit in the Supper is a source and leaven: for the creation of community both between human beings and God, and among human beings; for the

There is a lot coming up. I hope you will be able to join us.

Uniting Church Supports Youth Survey

The Uniting Church is assisting Mission
Australia in getting out the call to our youth
to participate in their Annual Youth Survey.
Since its inception in 2002, the survey has
highlighted the challenges facing
Australians aged 15-19, and has been a
strong advocate to government and other
policy makes in addressing the issues.

Close to 20,000 people completed the survey in 2023, nominating the environment, mental health, the economy, and racial discrimination among their top concerns.

The fastest growing issue in 2023 was housing and homelessness, which is set to feature even more prominently in 2024. When launching this year's survey, Mission Australia CEO, Sharon Callister stated that "cost of living issues (and) housing stress are impacting families."

The survey focuses on a wide range of topics, including schooling, general and mental health, relationships, employment opportunities, further study opportunities, regional issues, climate change, racism, sexism, stress, bullying and body image.

In 2024, there is a heightened focus on social media issues, domestic violence, drug and alcohol use including vaping, and loneliness.

The survey is open to all Australians aged 15-19 until August. It takes about twenty minutes to complete, and is completely confidential.

The results of the survey will be made available to governments, schools, policy making organisations and the media. It is hoped that Mission Australia will continue to press organisations to help implement policies that improve the lives of Australia's younger generation, and tackle the issues that will be highlighted in this survey.
